Purpose of Educational-Based Activities

The purpose is the human growth and development of student-athletes and connecting them to caring adults whose priority is to utilize sports in their growth and development.



All Sports Meeting

All athletes and parents of athletes (grades 7-12) will be required to attend a mandatory online meeting before activities begin. Students will not be allowed to participate unless parents attend the meeting online and fill out the Google Form with signature confirming that all information was received.

This meeting is set up to open better channels of communications between parents and individual programs, to provide information, take care of paperwork and fees associated with their son's or daughter's participation in activities and to deal with issues of sportsmanship. By working together we can make things run more smoothly and stop most miscommunication before it starts.

Activity Parent Meetings



Each advisor or head coach has his or her own way of communicating with parents.

Please make every effort to attend the parent meeting that the coach or advisor schedules for your son or daughter's activity.

In the case that there is lack of communication or a parent meeting, please contact the coach or advisor. If they fail to respond, please let Activities Director Dave Rocheleau know.



Impact Testing

We have been doing the Impact Testing for several years. This needs to be done every three years. All incoming 7th graders as well as anyone who has never taken the Impact test should plan on taking it regardless of your grade level.

More information will follow with the testing schedule. The school nurse will be handling the administration of the testing.

Concussions and Return to Play



- An ImPACT test does not treat a concussion and is not a final diagnosis of a concussion, but is one tool that helps assess the readiness for return to play. The post-injury test is compared to a pre-injury baseline or against societal norms for age and gender to determine if a patient is ready to begin the return-to-play process.
- 5-step process to further ensure a safe return. This process was mandated by the Minnesota State High School League in 2011. Each step requires a minimum of 24 hours before proceeding to the next step. This is to ensure that symptoms do not return when the body is placed under stress and with increased heart rate. Concussions and Return to Play

•A summary, specific to the return to play steps, is as follows:

- Step 1A: Must be symptom free with cognitive exertion and return school.
- Step 1B:Pass Impact Test, Perform Light aerobic activity such as a Stationary Bike Workout as directed by the AT.
- Step 2: Perform Moderate aerobic activity such as a Jog workout as directed by the AT.
- Step 3: Perform Heavy aerobic activity such as a sprint workout as directed by the AT, and if this goes well a non-contact practice can be conducted.
- Step 4: Perform a contact practice, but no games.
- Step 5: Game play
- STEP 6: RETURN TO PLAY WITH NO RESTRICTIONS: Athlete must be cleared by Select Therapy with a written clearance or a medical provider for full return to play.

Should symptoms return during one of the steps, the patient will need to rest a minimum of 24 hours and return to the prior step and complete that step again before attempting the symptomatic step again.

Participation in activities is a privilege that must be earned. There is a common misconception that as a student-athlete gets older, the amount of playing time they will experience will increase. This is far from true and many times just the opposite. The amount of playing time a student enjoys will reflect his/her skill level and the continual work they put in to improve those skills and abilities.



1. **JH Team Sports**: Learning skills is the priority here and not winning. Playing time should be as equal as possible. Students should have opportunities to play various positions as their skill level allows. Unexcused absences from practices as well as poor attitude toward coaches and teammates will affect playing time. Please note that equal playing time will not be guaranteed at tournaments.



2. C Squad/Junior Varsity Team Sports: Playing time is not guaranteed at these levels of competition and is not based on grade level. The coach will decide what position will allow a player the greatest success and which will best benefit the team. Playing time is not distributed on an equal basis and again absences from practices as well as a poor attitude toward coaches and teammates will affect playing time and could cause dismissal from the team. While winning should not be considered the primary goal at this level, it is a goal!



3. Varsity Team Sports: A high priority is placed on winning at this level. Coaches will control who plays, how much they play, and what position they play. Practices are mandatory and unexcused absences will have consequences that are explained at the beginning of the season.



Individual Sports and Activities: In sports such as Wrestling or Golf and activities such as Speech, teams are established on the basis of an individual's trials and performances through competitions with fellow participants (i.e.: wrestle-offs). Practices and playing time would be treated similarly to those of the various levels of team sports.

Team Placement



Teams will be determined by the individual player's skill level, not limited to players according to their grade level.

Attitude and work ethic do come into play as well. There are always talented kids that may not get the playing time they feel they deserve. This is most times due to attitude and/or level of effort given at practices.

Communication



Parenting and coaching are both tough jobs! We need to communicate and work together.

Expect from your son/daughter's coach:

- Coach's Philosophy and team handbook
- Locations and times of all practices and contests and cancellations



Communication continued...

Expectations from parents:

- Be a good fan! Cheer for our team: not against the other team.
- Please show officials respect. Do not get down on them: instead take all that energy you have and cheer for our team!
- Notify the coach of any schedule conflicts in advance. Be prepared when absences are not considered excused. Vacations are not excused!
- Understand procedures when there are conflicts
- If you attempt to contact a coach or advisor and they do not return your calls, emails, etc. please contact AD Dave Rocheleau. This is not acceptable.

Communication continued...



Each coach/advisor should inform parents of office hours or good ways to communicate if there is a need. Do not:

- approach a coach before or after an event or a practice to discuss a conflict.
- approach a coach in a public setting with other parents or participants nearby.
- approach your son or daughter during an event. This includes halftime or between sets, etc.

Emotions run high, please wait until they are under control.



Conflict between School Activities

The students at Pierz are involved in lots of different activities. Communicate with your coaches or supervisors!

When conflicts arise, be prepared to make a decision and accept the outcomes that come with that decision.





In order to participate in extracurricular activities – Students, Parents and Coaches/Advisors need to fully read and be aware of the contents contained in the *Athletic Eligibility Brochure* issued by the Minnesota State High School League at the onset of each new school year.

Academic Eligibility



Academic Eligibility refers to academic standards that students must uphold to be eligible to participate in extracurricular activities. These activities are in the areas of **fine arts, athletics and academic extensions**.

NOTE: In order to be placed on the individual activity Master Eligibility List of the local School District (required by the MSHSL), the Activities Director must be able to answer Yes to this question, "Is the student making satisfactory progress toward the school's graduation requirements?" If the Activities Director is unable to answer yes to that question – the student cannot not be placed on the Master Eligibility List and therefore not eligible to participate.

Academic Eligibility continued...



In addition to the MSHSL conditions listed above, the following Pierz School District policy of academic conditions have also been established and pertain to academic eligibility:

- To be eligible to participate in extra-curricular activities at Pierz Healy High School students must pass all classes. Grade checks will be made on the dates coinciding with the academic performance reports. If a student is not passing all classes at this time, he/she will be ineligible for contests for one week (Monday Saturday following the grade check) and will not be eligible again until they are passing all their classes. Checks will be made on a weekly basis (every Friday or the last day of the school week) for the ineligible person to regain eligibility.
- 2024-25 Grade Checks Dates are: Oct 8, Nov 22, Jan 17, March 5, April 17, May 30
- Grades will be pulled at 8:15am on all those dates except on May 30 they will be pulled at 4:00pm

Academic Eligibility continued...



- For calculation of the ineligible time period, a student will become ineligible the first day of the academic week following the end of the grading period. Example: If grades come out on a Wednesday and a student is deemed ineligible due to their grades would become ineligible on Monday of the following week through that Saturday and must get signed off to become eligible again.
- In consideration of the MSHSL requirement of making "satisfactory progress towards graduation", should a student incessantly struggle with academic eligibility, continued efforts to remain in extracurricular activities may need to be reconsidered.

Insurance



School District #484 - Pierz has no provision for medical insurance coverage for participants and it is the responsibility of each participant to provide his/her own coverage. School District #484 does provide the option for the participant to purchase their own coverage through Student Assurances Service Incorporated. School District #484 is covered by the MSHSL catastrophic insurance program.

Medical Policy



- The general rule is that incoming seventh graders, tenth grade students, as well as transfer students will need physical examinations.
- Physical examinations are required at least once every three years and medical forms must be on file in the Pierz high school athletic office before participation can be allowed.
- Participants are responsible for their own physical examinations at their own expense.
- The **MSHSL Parents Permit and Health Questionnaire** must also be fully completed, signed by the participant and parent/guardian, and on file in the athletic office before participation can be allowed.
- After any surgery or serious illness/injury, the attending physician must verify in writing the student's readiness for participation. This physician's verification must also be on file in the high school office.





There will be an activity fee assessed **for each participant for each activity** in which they participate. The fees are as follows:

9-12 Sports

• 1st sport \$80; 2nd \$80; 3rd \$30

7-8 Sports

• 1st sport \$50; 2nd \$50; 3rd Free

Weight Room if not in season - \$50




